# CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

I hope you all enjoyed the Coronation celebrations?

The BVA certainly gave us the elements for a fun time. What a pity the weather did not oblige too, especially on the Saturday evening. Never mind, it was nice and cosy in the marquee, the beer flowed well and the music the usual delight. Oh, and I must not forget the traditional Beyton fireworks, they get bigger and better every time!

A big thanks to the BVA team, they did us proud as usual.

Sunday was much warmer and calmer allowing everyone to join in the games, or just sit and chat with friends over more beer and homemade refreshments.

Of course, the celebrations were focussed and enjoyed on our Village Green which brings me to the important subjects of ownership of the Green and insurance liability. The most important point is that the landowners, the Ladies of the Manor have taken out an appropriate insurance to cover public liability for potential injury to anyone using the green, therefore, consequently this major concern is now off the table, at least for the time being.

Nevertheless, the Parish Council believe that the running of the green should be in the hands of the people of Beyton and to this end we are continuing to pursue its potential purchase.

The work on the village pond is almost complete, the next task is to spread the heap of silt onto parts of the green to improve levels. The silt is too wet to spread now and needs further drying, as long as we don't get a wet summer the work should be completed in late August early September.

Meanwhile, I see the geese are enjoying their new deep-water habitat.

#### A14 road works:

Penny Otton, our Suffolk County Councillor, kindly arranged for senior staff from National Highways and their main subcontractor John Sisk to attend the Annual Parish meeting on the 9th May to listen to concerns resulting from the A14 work.

Sixteen parishioners joined the meeting and there were very lengthy discussions about the significant increase in traffic volumes through the village especially on Thurston Rd and Tostock Rd. Our Speed Watch team reported over 3 times the normal volume, particularly during the late afternoon, but no increase in speeding. Additional signage has been erected and more considered wording on signs on the A14 designed to keep traffic on the highway rather than seeking alternative routes through local villages was agreed.

Following this initiative there does seem to be some improvement.

# THURSTON COMMUNITY COLLEGE NEWS

It gives me tremendous pleasure to use this edition of the newsletter to tell you about the new recording studio which was recently opened at Thurston Sixth. This is the Sixth Form element of Thurston Community College and is located on a beautiful campus within the Parish of Beyton.



The recording studio's specialist equipment, sound proofing and resources was all made possible through a generous donation of £3,000 from the Rick Keeling Memorial Trust. The trust was established in 1989 following the untimely death of Rick Keeling, the Head of Science, at the then Thurston Upper School. Rick Keeling was an outstanding science teacher who also had a passion for music; he was well known for his involvement in the school productions and for playing in local bands. His friends and former colleagues still raise money for the fund to support students and educational projects at Thurston Community College.

The Rick Keeling Recording Studio was an idea initially proposed by two of our Sixth Form students, Declan and Oscar, who both left last year after completing their A Level examinations. They came up with a design and a technical proposal that would radically change the way in which they could create their music for the Sixth Form music course they were studying. The Rick Keeling Fund kindly offered to fund the whole project and worked with Declan, Oscar and current students and staff to build this wonderful new facility. The Rick Keeling Memorial Trust funded the entire project, enabling students and staff to dream a little bigger. The studio sits within two re-purposed music practice rooms at the Sixth Form campus in Beyton which both Main School and Sixth Form students will be able to access over the coming years.





The official opening was attended by trustees from the charity. Students gave a live demonstration of the studio followed by speeches. Richard Fawcett, Chair of the Rick Keeling Memorial Trust, said: "The recording studio is a fantastic addition to the performing arts faculty at Thurston Sixth and is already providing students with opportunities to make music recordings of a very high standard. The Trust is delighted to be able to support such a tremendous addition to the facilities of Thurston Community College."

The intention is to also make this facility open to use by the public through our Hiring and Lettings Team. We will be holding an event in the summer term for members of the community to come along to view The Rick Keeling Recording Studio and along with a demonstration by the students of the full potential of this new facility at the College.

#### **King's Coronation Events**

The Coronation events all ran smoothly despite the weather threatening to spoil them.

On the Saturday evening after the Coronation, the live bands The Larks followed by the Kitchenettes played in the marquee. It was great to see such a large turnout so early in the evening, possibly motivated by the offer of a complimentary glass of prosecco for the first 100 people to arrive. As result a lot of people were up dancing at the end!

On the Sunday it was so warm that the tables were set up outside for the Big Lunch street party rather than inside the marquee. People ate and drank the shared food while watching the children playing rounders and taking part in traditional races.

The most tightly contested pull was between the girls which went on for approx 3 minutes with first one team and then the other dominating before the Beyton girls finally succumbed to the power of greater numbers in the Non Beytonian team.
